The number of foreign nationals who come to Japan as students or technical interns and get involved in a crime by temptation of "simple part-time job" or "you can earn money easily" <u>through the internet or social media</u> is increasing.

Criminal groups gain unauthorized computer access to internet banking and transfer money to bank accounts prepared beforehand. Foreign students studying in Japan get involved in the commission of a crime when they withdraw the money from the bank.



Case 2 Criminal groups approach students by saying they will buy the bank accounts at a high price and have the foreign students open the bank account. In this way, foreign students become involved in the commission of a crime.

Criminal groups use credit cards in the name of another person to purchase items and they send them to a vacant apartment room. Foreign students studying in Japan get involved in the commission of a crime when they receive the items from the room.
